There followed a long and hazardous journey via Paris, Switzerland, Spain, eventually reaching Gibraltar and onwards to Great Britain and freedom.



Friends of Cotgrave Country Park

Hello and welcome to my summer report. We are now nearly half way through the year already.

Lets get the negatives out of the way first.

The building work is still creating problems and no doubt will do for some time. People have shown concern about the muddy water being pumped through the park from the building site alongside the footpath from the car park. Yes, I agree, it doesn't look very nice but it is being taken care of under controlled conditions and any environmental concerns we are told have been taken care of. Inspections have been made by the Environment Agency and a clean bill of health given.

The works at the top of Heron Lake to build a new filtration system for run off water seem to have taken longer than promised but by the time you read this they will be at an end. The damaged pathways and grass will be made good by the contractors.

Spring has come and nearly gone – trees are now into full leaf. Snowdrops have been seen and bluebells have made a showing in the wood from Mill Lane.

So what's been going on since I last spoke.

Leaky hollow – hopefully the corralled area is working as various types of wildlife have been seen there. Tufted ducks and smew have been spotted especially on canal. Summer visitors (Birds) are starting to return to the park and according to our resident bird expert, Chiff Chaffs have already done so. Up to now I have not heard any cuckoos

Hedge laying is now complete at the top of Colliers Mount. As a result the lower hedge height now gives further views across the Nottingham country side. This was a hard and difficult job and my thanks goes to all volunteers who took part in this task.

The park has been remapped by Notts CC and is shown below. Copies of these maps are available at Cotgrave library and various outlets throughout Cotgrave. They are there for your use so feel free to pick them up. On the subject of mapping, I bumped into a family who were having great fun doing the orienteering course around

the park. This is basically a route around the park using a map and grid references to locate markers around the park. It is good fun and can be done solo or as a group. The map itself can be picked up in Cotgrave library or downloaded from the community web site, www.cotgravecommunity.com. Over the Mayday weekend the park hosted another charity fun run organised by Retts Run For Life I hope it proves as popular as last year. The deadline for this report is just before the more news will follow in the day itself so Autumn edition, I wish all who take part well.

If this report appears to be a little on the short side then forgive me but I'm actually writing this whilst on holiday in South Wales.

Finally, Bryan Tansley our ex group chairman has now left Cotgrave for pastures new. He has emigrated to Australia to spend his retirement with his family who are out there. On behalf of the group and all who know Bryan I would like to wish him well.

The Club was run by volunteers from all 3 Cotgrave churches and was attended by 39 primary school children. The event was based on Scripture Union course 'Mega Makers' and followed the theme that God's love is Greater and Greater, Deeper and and Deeper, Wider and Wider and for Ever and Ever.

Cotgrave Candleby Lane's Fantastic Curriculum

Candleby Lane School has always had an Innovative approach to our curriculum to ensure that the children's learning goes beyond the classroom and the academic

subjects. We strongly believe we are preparing children for life! As a result we have designed an alternative curriculum which takes place on a Monday afternoon called Candleby Life. The purpose of this curriculum is to ensure we focus on some of the key character traits and life skills which children will need as they move through their lives. Activities focus on co-operation initiative, teamwork, enterprise, confidence, awareness and collaboration. We invite community members in to work with the children; the Cotgrave Police Officers work with a group called Candleby Cops, a group works with Cotgrave Country Park developing the park and learning from the volunteers; Experian and Capital One have worked with groups on creating business plans and marketing, some children have worked with Eton Park residents. In addition to this some of the activities have an enterprise theme, researching, developing and producing items to sell to the children and parents, the profit from these activities either goes to a named charity or the children use it to develop school resources. We prepare the younger children by engaging them in exciting skill based sessions.

Transforming Cotgrave - a happening place!

Town centre

Plans for the Town Centre are continuing to progress, with designs being created for the proposed layout. It is likely to include a new multi-service centre which will bring together the Doctors surgery, Police, Council and Library.

We are hoping to share these plans with you at a showcase event in July. Details of this event are still to be finalised, but when they are we will let you know via the Town Council website and noticeboards, Rushcliffe Borough Councils' website, Twitter and Facebook pages. Keep an eye out for further information to ensure you don't miss this exciting event.

Homebuilders team up with schools to give kids insight into construction

Pupils at two local schools had a glimpse into the world of construction and engineering thanks to the Hollygate Park developer Barratt Homes and the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB).

They launched the 'CREST' Challenge at South Wolds Academy and South Nottinghamshire Academy, for all year 9 geography students. The event included a hands-on activity that tested students' creative and teamwork abilities, and talks from different professions such as architects and ecologists involved in building a development like Hollygate Park. The students were set a challenge to work in teams on a project to design and plan a new housing development, and their entries will be judged by a panel at each school. The winning team from each school will be asked to present their project to the Strategic Board responsible for the Cotgrave development which is chaired by Allen Graham, Chief Executive to Rushcliffe Borough Council.

Hollygate Park Development

The inlet (outlet works) on Heron Lake at the Hollygate Lane development end are complete but there are still some more minor outlet works at the far end of Heron Lake to complete. However this won't restrict use of any of the country park tracks. Some works to the footpath and cycleway from Hollygate Lane to Colston Gate are due to start soon. The building of the show homes is progressing well and they should be open in the early summer.

Temporary traffic restrictions

Scrimshire Lane (between Cherry Orchard and Risegate), Cotgrave, will be closed for approximately two hours between 8am and 6pm on 14 June.

Temporary signals will be on both Main Road, Cotgrave and Stragglethorpe Road, Cotgrave, from 11 May until 17 July, whilst Western Power Distribution install new electricity cables in the highway.

Employment and training opportunities

Employment and training opportunities have been secured by several local young people with Barratts David Wilson Homes. Further opportunities are likely to become available in different trades as the build programme progresses.

New £10 million school build for South Nottinghamshire Academy

The rebuilding of South Nottinghamshire Academy in Radcliffe on Trent has started under the Government's Priority Schools Building Programme. Bowmer and Kirkland has started construction work and the new building is planned to open in September 2016.

Dan Philpotts (Head of Academy) stated that "planning and consultation has been taking place for some time, and we have had to make some difficult community decisions along the way, but it is a wonderful, once in a lifetime opportunity for our community to have a fantastic fit for purpose new school building. Our students only get one chance at their secondary education and we will finally have an incredible resource to add value to our provision."



The building is a three storey finger block design which meets the educational needs of the current students and future generations. General and practical teaching spaces have been organised in suites with a sense of identity, but allowing some variation in the range of spaces. The new build is efficient and provides a dining space which is a central focus to the school and can be used as a milling space during the school day and, in conjunction with the hall and drama space, for after-school events.

South Nottinghamshire Academy is committed to being at the heart of the community with facilities readily available and accessible for the local community.

Modern facilities

The new building will have an intelligent building energy management system that will use advanced technology to manage the heating, lighting, acoustics and ventilation. It will also accommodate modern, fit for purpose facilities which will include:

- Specialist teaching areas: Art and Technology, English, Humanities, ICT, Maths, Modern Foreign Languages, Music and Science
- Spacious learning resource centre
- State of the art kitchen with a central dining room
- Main Hall / Theatre with bleacher seating
- Separate sixth form study room and common room
- Drama / Dance studio
- Fitness suite

The only existing facilities that will remain are the artificial floodlit pitch, tennis courts and the sports hall, with the latter receiving a significant refurbishment. Once complete, the new building will provide the school community with a long lasting, modern day facility that will enhance students' educational experience.
