		Take hand gel with you and use at regular intervals during your time at the park	
		No food or drink should be consumed in the play park areas.	
		Avoid touching your face	
		Children should be supervised carefully to maintain good hygiene and should not use playgrounds if they have any symptoms of coronavirus	
		Children should be encouraged to limit contact with anyone they do not live with	
		Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds as soon possible after leaving the park equipment and as you return home

Additional cleaning to take place of play equipment by use of suitable cleaning fluid will be carried out at least once per week. Additional cleans will take place if an outbreak occurs within the area before re- opening		
Contact points	Reducing number of touch points on the park area	Play equipment has been re-opened in line with Government guidelines from 4 July 2020
